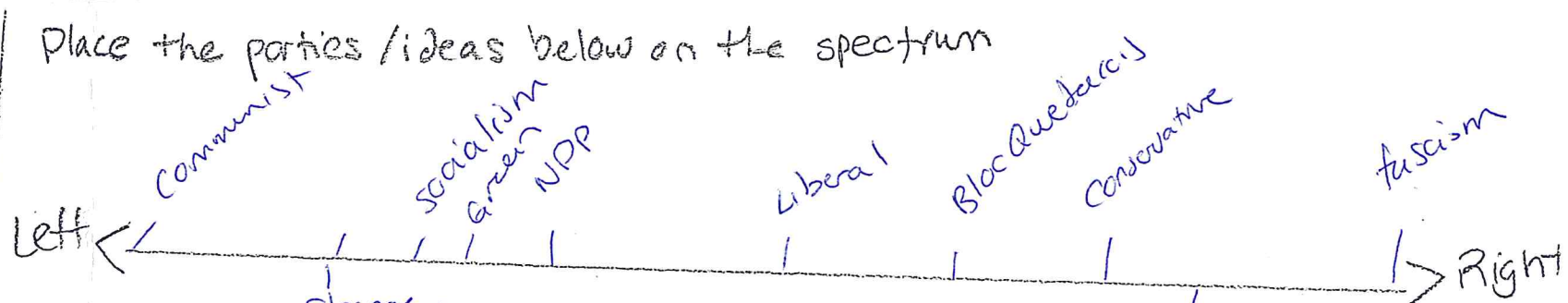
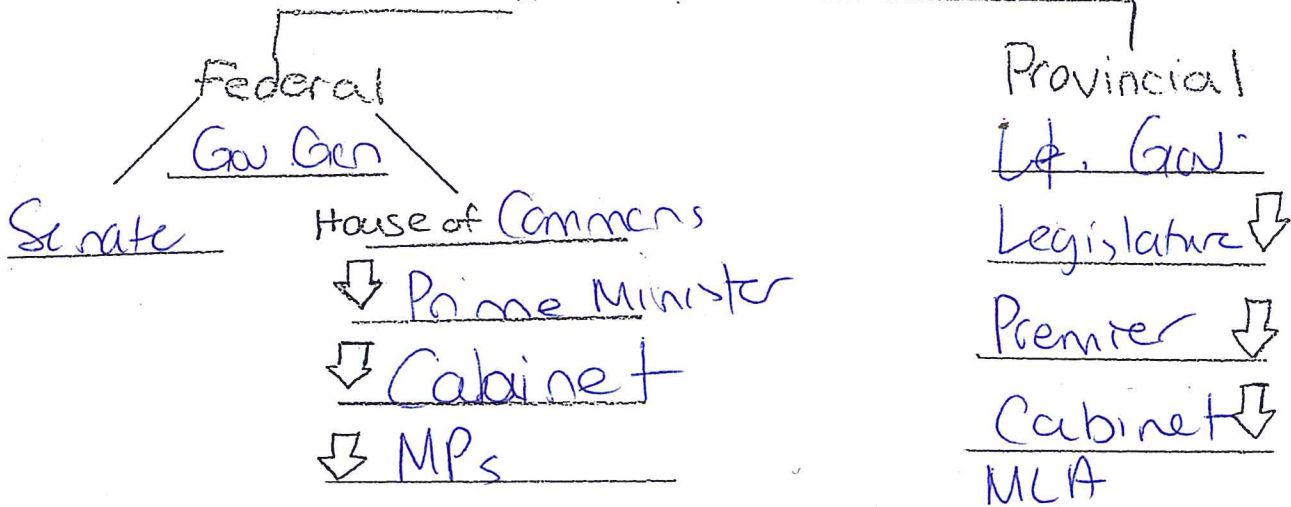

BNA ACT: Constitution prior to 1982

Bill of Rights: Pre-cursor to the Charter in 1960s

Constitution: Way gov't operates

Charter of Rights:

- * Mobility
- * Democratic
- * Legal
- * Equality
- * Official Languages
- * Minority
- * Fundamental (religion, thought, speech, press etc)

Notwithstanding Clause: Prov. can allow something to happen despite the charter, must renew every 5 years

Amending Formula: 1982 established how the constitution can be changed, 7 out of 11

- Second Reading
- Third Reading

2. Second
3. Committee
4. Report
5. 3rd Reading
6. Senate
7. Royal Assent

Steps in an Election

- 1) Dissolution
- 2) Enumeration
- 3) Nominations
- 4) Campaigning
- 5) Voting/Balloting
- 6) Tabulating

Terms

- Coalition: 2 parties working together to run country
- Riding: voters area
- Order in Council: bill passed
- Party Whip: discipline party members full not put out solidarity put parliament on hold
