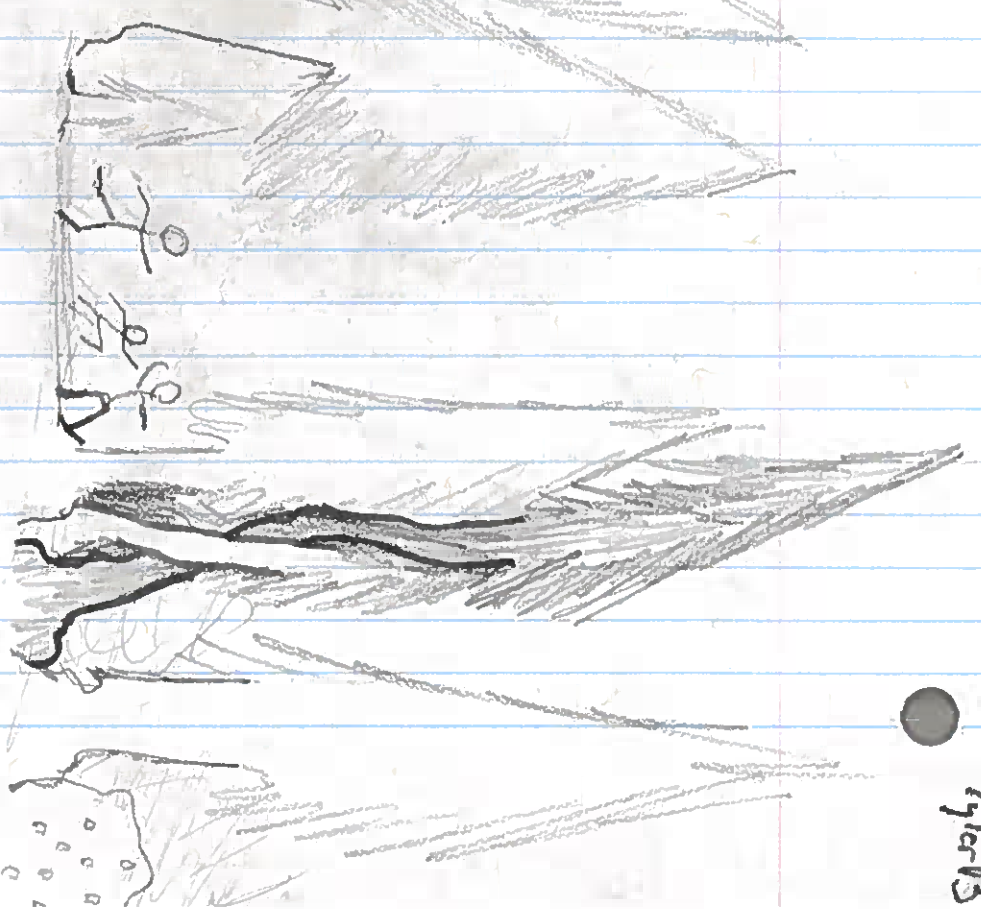


And then even after our way of life was being commoditized after our lands were filled with water companies and wealthy corporate investors... the church... came up with their solution and everything went to hell! pg. 88

The Earth was broken. Too much taking for too damn long, so she finally broke. But she went out like a wild horse bucking off as much as she could before lying down. pg. 87

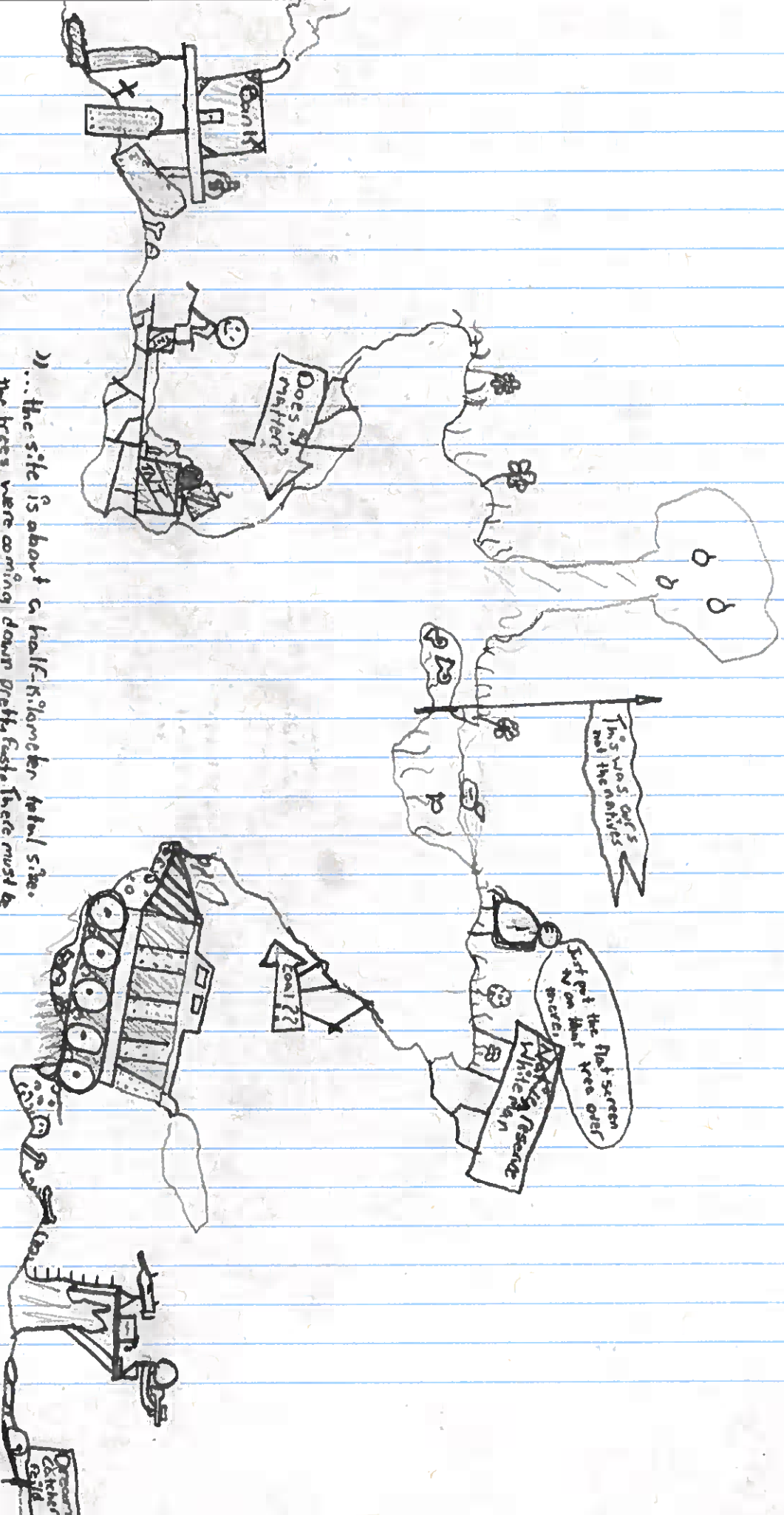
Greed and death moves the world to death taking more and more, finally killing the earth's hearts and marching into native lands killing and taking without consequence.
